## **CLIENT PARTNER SPOTLIGHT - SHERRY BURNETT**

There's a painting of a vibrant tiger hanging on the wall behind **Sherry Burnett** when our interview gets underway. The tiger – a symbol of strength, bravery and independence - will reveal itself as an apt animal for the courageous life she is now living.

Sherry is a straight talker, and she openly admits that the months following incarceration were hard but transformative. Her journey towards a brighter future began when she devoted herself to recovery and took important steps to regain custody of her teenage son.

To make that dream a reality, she would need a stable place to call home as well as a deposit and first month's rent. That's where The Fountain Fund stepped in, providing her with a \$1,600 loan. These funds made it possible for her to secure her very first apartment.

She glows in the retelling, "Getting my own place was huge. It gave me all types of confidence. It gave me a different type of self-worth."

This foundation set the stage for Sherry and her son to reunite. "I just remember the first time that I brought Dezmond to see the apartment... he was so excited. It was the

beginning of a completely different type of happiness. A type of happiness that I'd never known." Having a loving place to call home also resulted in a huge boost to her own emotional well-being as well as to her son's academic success.

Months later, when her used car's transmission failed, Sherry found herself in need once again. The Fountain Fund granted her a second loan of \$800 for repairs. She is proud to report that she has since repaid both loans, her credit score is rising, and the sense of accomplishment and gratitude she feels is immense. Her new husband, also a Client Partner, is feeling the elevation of a Fountain Fund auto loan, too!

Words of advice she would give to others? "Be willing to ask for help." She chuckles, "People can't help you with what you need unless you tell them!" She continues, "And stay in a grateful mind. Focus on what is right and keep positive people around you."

The Fountain Fund recently had the privilege of participating in **2025 Big Give**, an annual event organized by **Impact 100 Richmond**. This volunteer-driven women's philanthropy group selects finalists through an intensive vetting process which begins with a competitive grant cycle, followed by engaging site visits and culminating with an exciting night where five nonprofits compete – Shark Tank style! Since 2009, they have contributed over \$2 million to 37 nonprofits, supporting projects that create transformative change within the Richmond community.
